



DEI Targeted





State and federal antidiscrimination laws, remain in effect regardless of Exec. Order

The Executive Order directs federal agencies to include a provision in every contract requiring the contracting parties to certify that they do not operate any programs promoting DEI that violate any applicable federal antidiscrimination laws. Further, the Executive Order states that within 120 days of the order, the Administration should identify, for potential civil compliance investigations, "the most egregious and discriminatory DEI practitioners in each sector of concern," which will include publicly traded corporations, large nonprofits, foundations with more than \$500 million in assets, state and local bar and medical associations, and higher-education institutions with an endowment of more than \$1 billion.

Employers should review antidiscrimination policies and practices, or initiatives that could be labeled as DEI and come under scrutiny.

Employers should assess the risks and benefits of policies and initiatives to determine:

- which should remain in place
- which may need to be adjusted, reconfigured, or renamed
- and which should be jettisoned

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2 Sex Policy

Executive Order

Directs federal agencies to "remove all statements, policies, regulations, forms, or other internal and external messages that promote or otherwise inculcate gender ideology" and to "cease issuing such statements, policies, regulations, forms, communications, or other messages."



Of concern to private employers with government contracts, the order prohibits the use of federal funds to promote gender ideology and directs agencies to ensure that grant funds are not used to advance this ideology. The order requires the director of the Office of Management and Budget to implement "agency-imposed requirements on federally funded entities, including contractors, to achieve the policy of this order."

2 Sex Policy

Discrimination against transgender and non-binary/gender non-conforming individuals remains illegal under federal law, as well as under many state and local laws.

Federal Agency employees directed to remove pronouns from email signatures by Jan. 31, 2025







Employers should anticipate there will be changes to the filing instructions associated with the EEO-1 form. While the form previously included only binary options for employers to report the sex of their employees, employers that chose to do so could include non-binary employees by using the comment section of the form. Moving forward, that option will likely be eliminated.

EEOC indicated that the acting chair intends to propose rescission or revision of anti-harassment and other guidance relating to gender identity and sexual orientation that is in conflict with these orders.



Big Government Bureaucracy

Target:

Eliminate waste, cost, inefficient Fed agencies. Lower Gov't cost. Business Outcome –Lower taxes

Initial Targets:

China 10%

Mexico25%

Canada 25%

CN and MX Postponed

MX – 10K troops to border

Business / Economic Impact:

- Tariffs slows growth / devalues stock prices
- Postponements now easing market reaction
- Market already built-in some expectations
- May stall Fed lending rate cuts*
- Tough to measure in jobs, deficits, spending

Aluminum Steel All Imports 25%

Business / Economic Impact:

- US Steel, Nucor, Century Aluminum surge
- Divert product to Asia / Euro markets
- Raise price on US goods Hyundai
- Could drive new investments in US plants

Regulatory Freeze Pending Review

- Unknown in terms of recension of any business regulations
- Signals limiting federal regulation, lower compliance costs
- Free US Mfg. to compete globally

WHO Withdrawal

- US largest funder calling for reforms
- The most chaotic, least effective UN agency."
- Failed to enact reforms proposed over 2 decades, lead to deterioration in management & scientific expertise.

EV Auto Zero Emission

- Attacks 50% EV vehicle mandate by 2030
- Reform likely, address charging stations, reasonable EV goals
- Address energy structure to support EV's
- Natural momentum and sates laws will still ensure EV activity

Inflation Reduction

- Economy & Inflation ranked #1 election issue
- Requires "all executive departments & agencies to deliver emergency price relief" to Americans
- Focus, energy, housing, deregulation, groceries
